Prayer in the Style of Taizé is a meditative type of worship that incorporates beautiful repetitive songs based on scripture, brief scripture readings, and a short time of silence that invite prayer of the heart. Holy Communion is also offered along with a prayerful candle-lighting opportunity. This service began in September 1999 at AHUMC and is now in its 25th year of ministry.

Our order of worship is based on the ones used by the ecumenical Christian Community of Taizé in France. The Taizé Community in France was founded by Brother Roger Schultz, a Swiss protestant who wanted to bring reconciliation between Protestants and Catholics following World War II. Today this community of over 100 Brothers plus an order of Sisters welcome thousands of young people (age 18-35) each summer, a week at a time. People come from all over the world for retreat, prayer and worship with the Community. The Taizé Community is an ecumenical order of Protestant, Catholic, and Orthodox Christians.
