About Taizé:

Taizé music uses simple repetitive words designed to become a sung prayer. Sometimes Latin words are used, a language considered to be universal.

Silence is essential to the heart of prayer, for when we are silent, God can speak to us. *Be still and know that I am God!* (Psalm 46:10)

Icons are sacred images that allow one to pray with the eyes, gazing into the realities of the Kingdom of God. They create a space of peace and are appropriate to the Christian Seasons.

The Taizé Community in France was founded by Brother Roger Schultz, a Swiss protestant who desired to bring reconciliation between Protestants and Catholics following World War II. Today this community of over 100 Brothers plus an order of Sisters welcome thousands of young people (age 18-35) each summer, a week at a time. People come from all over the world for retreat, prayer and worship with the Community. The Taizé Community is an ecumenical order of Protestant, Catholic, and Orthodox Christians.
